## Town Board Updates

An audit was conducted by the Office of Community Renewal (OCR) for Water District 6. It was found that the town is not in possession of the original home owner surveys related to the grant application. Supervisor Gaesser has responded to their concerns, outlining the measures which will be taken to prevent recurrence of this type of concern.

The Deputy Commissioner of the OCR and the Economic Developer for OCR visited February 19th to conduct an audit of the Eagle Creek Marina Grant and to tour the marina facility with Supervisor Gaesser, Councilman Pritchard and the owner of Eagle Creek Marina. A meeting was held regarding the status of the grant and the OCR's suggestions. Subsequent to this meeting, the OCR granted an extension of the Eagle Creek Marina Grant to September 30, 2010.

The Kendall Town Board entered into an inter-municipal agreement with the Kendall Central School District Board of Education for the operation and maintenance of the community park.

The Town Board and the School Board held a joint meeting to discuss dedication of Noon Boulevard and Breshe Drive. The primary concerns are the right-of-way, drainage, waterlines, and plowing issues. Engineers from Monroe County Water Authority visited to discuss their concerns for receiving the water line.

### JUSTICE COURT



We are pleased to announce that through a grant from the Justice Court Assistance Program, we will have a beautiful new bench this summer. Construction began on May 4<sup>th</sup> by Karl Driesel, a local contractor.

**New Law:** It is now a felony in New York to drive drunk or under the influence of drugs with a child in the vehicle, and will require first-time DWI offenders to install an ignition interlock device in their vehicles. This new law is Leandra's Law in honor of an 11-year-old girl who was killed in a drunken driving accident.

Under the law, first-time offenders with a blood alcohol content of .08 or more or under the influence of drugs, and with a child age 15 or under in the vehicle, will automatically have their drivers license suspended, will have to install the ignition device and may be charged with a Class E felony punishable by up to four years in prison.

Intoxicated drivers who cause serious injury to a child may be charged with a Class C felony punishable by up to 15 years in prison, and drunken drivers who cause the death of a child will be charged with a Class B felony that could bring up to 25 years in prison.

In addition to the increased sanctions, parents caught driving impaired with their children will be reported to the Statewide Central Register of child Abuse and Maltreatment.

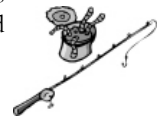

## The Planning Board

Over the last several months the Planning Board at the request of the Town Board has been rewriting section "711 Junk Yards" of the Town Zoning Ordinance. The Planning Board has made recommendations to the Town Board for a revised Junk Yard Ordinance and a new "Storage Container" Ordinance. The Planning Board is now reviewing comments from the Town Attorney and the Town Board. A final document, accepted by the Town Board, will be submitted to the County Planning Board for its review. After all reviews are complete the Town Board will hold a public hearing, review public input, make final changes if necessary and consider adoption.

At the request of the Town Board the Planning Board is also revisiting the Hamlet, Waterfront Residential and Waterfront Development districts accessory structure building codes. The challenge on the lake is the wide diversity of lot sizes that were created from the 1950's onward. These lots range from very small with a cottage to larger or combined lots with year round homes. The planning Board is trying to offer our residents more definitive and definite guide lines for accessory structure sizes and setbacks from streets, lake shore or lake view property and private right-of-ways. Again our role is to make recommendations to the Town Board for their review.

Planning Board meetings are always open to the public. If you have a project that requires Planning Board involvement, come and see us as early as possible, even before the application is started. This will allow us and the Code Enforcement Officer to guide you through the site review process.

## Code Enforcement

Building Season is in full swing. Be sure to contact us for information on building and inspection permit requirements.
