New A/V project at Concordia

Church council has been exploring options to add a closed-circuit video feed from our sanctuary to the Fellowship Hall. We've been working with Duane Schepler about options and affordability. Duane is the "Broadcast AV Manager" at Fingerlakes Gaming and has a substantial knowledge and experience.

The goal is to be able to have a live video feed of the sanctuary available in the Fellowship Hall on a television mounted on the wall. In the past two years we have had funerals and other events where we feel we ought to have been able broadcast the worship service to the other room and council roundly agrees that the project is overdue. A camera in the sanctuary and a new TV in the Fellowship Hall would have multiple functions:

Live video and audio feed of services to the Fellowship Hall

Digital recording of the sanctuary

We could offer for weddings, baptisms, and funerals Recording of sermons and children's programs Posting video to social media

Smart TV in the Fellowship Hall

Movies and videos for fellowship events DVD/Bluray player and HDMI inputs Smart TV capability

We look forward to having and sharing more details with you about this. We are hoping for an April install date and will need to have a congregational meeting approve the expense from the Memorial Fund so we will keep you posted!

Members Present: Pastor Steven Meyer, Dorrie Hardenbrook, Nancy Comstock, Beth Schmidt, Robin Schepler, Tibbs Ahlberg, Russ Levett

Meeting opened at 7:05 p.m. with special needs and concerns shared.

Nancy Comstock made a motion to accept the agenda, seconded by Dorrie Hardenbrook carried.

Cathy Herman motioned to accept the March minutes, Robin Schepler seconded, carried.

Pastor's Report: Sunday service - 3, Special Events - Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, Euchre Tournament. Visitations - home-7, sick/hospital-3, shut-in-20 total 30 (1 inactive, 3 non-member), Meetings-9, Counselings-8, Weddings-0, Funeral-0, vacation used 1 week in January (5 days including 1 Sunday) Sick Time Feb. 13 1/2 day. Pastor is pleased with the visitation ministry meeting. The A/V equipment for the sanctuary is being taken care of by Duane Schepler and should be installed soon. There has been some issues with our sound system, Duane thinks it could be cell phone interference. Also there is a frayed wire in Pastor's head set and Duane is fixing it. Jimmy Hartmann played the guitar on Palm Sunday and sang with the children. There are two new potential families to join the church. Cub Scout Charter Organization representative will be Heather Tomasino. Joette Knapp gave back her key and it was given to the lawn chair ladies. Euchre Tournament fund raiser was a success. There were 28 players and brought in \$1,505.00.

Finance Committee: There was \$4,098.70 in non budgeted expenses. Perhaps that is the kitchen fund money. The memorial fund has \$19,218.75 in it.

Christian Education: The talent show is June 4th before church. The children's sermon was a little lengthy on Easter but the kids like the Lego thing. Pastor told the Holy Week story with lego scenes.

Mutual Ministry: Have met with Pastor and are meeting with Pastor Frank Hanrahan next week and council members are invited to attend.

Property Committee: National Grid will come to the church and give an estimate on how much it will cost to replace all the light fixtures. The divider in the kitchen will be put back up.

Fellowship & Hospitality: Wine and Cheese is May 5th.

Worship and Music: \$400 from a bake sale will be used to buy a cabinet to display old communion ware and other historical things.

Cub Scouts: Heather Tomasino will be the church representative.

Clothes Closet: Jill is consolidating into one room for the summer.

Old Business: The insurance adjustor came and looked at the south side of the church roof. Wind damage from the storm caused approximately \$14,000 in damages. We will get a check for that minus 10% and our deductible. The Euchre tournament raised \$1,505.00

New Business: Cub Scouts: The lawn chair ladies have a key to the church. Joette Knapp gave her key back. The Rummage sale in the first weekend in August.

Russ Levett made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Robin Schepler seconded the motion, carried. Meeting ended at 7:55 p.m.
