In the summer of 2011, the results of a routine blood test changed Ralph and Beverly Olneys' lives forever. Ralph was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia, a type of blood cancer that can quickly be fatal without treatment.

Ralph was admitted to Wilmot's Blood and Marrow Transplant Unit and received his first stem cell transplant, which was successful. Then in early 2014, Ralph and Beverly faced a major setback when Ralph fell out of remission and needed to have a second transplant.
