6-14-17 TRUSTEE MEETING

In attendance: Ralph Olney, John Curtis, Tom Ingraham, Gary House, Sandy Strasenburgh, Pastor Jim Richardson, Marilynn Kundrata

Meeting was opened with prayer at 7:30 pm.

The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed, a motion was made by Sandy to approve, Gary seconded, approved.

Ralph presented the Treasurer's Report. The Endowment fund is up, all line items are on or below budget. The Chicken BBQ raised over \$1,500. (Thanks for all your hard work Sandy!) No investment changes are recommended, although Ralph suggested transferring \$4,000 from investment income to the Capital Fund, to protect our investment from market fluctuation and in anticipation of steeple repairs and back door replacement which will cost approximately \$3,000. Gary made a motion to approve the transfer, Sandy seconded.

Ralph researched phone options and found that if we changed to a business phone we could save \$480 per year. Sandy made a motion to approve the change, Gary seconded.

Gary made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, Sandy seconded, approved.

The Rummage Sale will be held June 23rd and 24th. John Curtis will install the air conditioners.

Partyka's asked if they could use the wagon. It was suggested that we let them keep it with the stipulation that we can use it for the CURE picnic. Gary made a motion to approve, Sandy seconded.

The CURE picnic will be September 23rd.

Two cherry trees in the yard will need to be replaced.

The Curtis' donated a gas grill for the church's use.

Tops donated a \$25 gift card. It was decided to give it to Brad Miller for the use of the youth group.

Sandy expanded advertising to include the Suburban News. She put in an ad for the rummage sale in both the Hamlin Herald and Suburban News.
