LOOKING BACK TO SEE FORWARD

"Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; nor His ear heavy, that it cannot hear. But your iniquities have separated you from your God; and your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He will not hear. For your hands are defiled with blood, and your fingers with iniquity; your lips have spoken lies, your tongue has muttered perversity. No one calls for justice, nor does any plead for truth. They trust in empty words and speak lies; they conceive evil and bring forth iniquity. They hatch vipers' eggs and weave the spider's web; he who eats of their eggs dies, and from that which is crushed a viper breaks out. Their webs will not become garments, nor will they cover themselves with their works; their works are works of iniquity, and the act of violence is in their hands. Their feet run to evil, and they make haste to shed innocent blood; their thoughts are thoughts of iniquity; wasting and destruction are in their paths. The way of peace they have not known, and their is no justice in their ways; they have made themselves crooked paths; whoever takes that way shall not know peace" (Isaiah 59:1-8).

The above Scripture was written sometime during the eighth century before the birth of Jesus Christ. It is God's evaluation of

Israel at that time. It is also a good assessment of the overall culture in the USA. Of course, not everyone is like that but when a certain percentage falls under God's scrutiny, it is a societal thing rather than an individual problem.

Now My eyes will be open and My ears attentive to prayer made in this place" (2 Chronicles 7:13-15).

See, the Scriptures do not say anything about politicians or the general public, but it says, "My people." "My people" means those of us who have decided to worship God in Spirit and in truth and obey His commandments from a loving and grateful heart. God is not hard to get along with; He is the One that makes the first move toward salvation and healing: "Come now, and let us reason together," says the Lord, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall be as wool. If you are willing and obedient, you shall eat the good of the land; but if you refuse and rebel, you shall be devoured by the sword"; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken. (Isaiah 1:18-20).

Go to the polls and vote. And when you pray, pray for the moral fabric of this nation because that is where it is the weakest.
