"And if it seems evil to you to serve the Lord, choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served that were on the other side of the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. Now, I suppose there may be some people who would say I am trying to tell them how to live their lives and use their resources. No, but if anyone will read their Bible on a regular basis they will discover that God is telling them how to live life that will honor Him. What I have written is only a short reminder to those who do not read their Bibles very often, if at all. And here is the rationale' behind it all in Romans 12:1-2: "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

## 8-16-17 TRUSTEE MEETING

In attendance: Ralph Olney, John Curtis, Sandy Strasenburgh, Tony Callari, Tom Ingraham, Gary House, Pastor Jim Richardson

Meeting was opened with prayer at 7:00 pm.

The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed, a motion was made by Sandy to approve, Gary seconded, approved.

Ralph presented the Treasurer's Report. The Endowment fund is up, all line items are on or below budget. \$4000 was transferred to checking to be used for the steeple repair (residing, replaced support beams). No investment changes were recommended. Gary made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, Sandy seconded, approved.

A special thank you to Ralph and Bev for their devoted time with painting the doors of the church entrance and back exit door.

It was agreed that the front bathroom in McQueen Hall needs to be "freshened" up, and Ralph is willing to tackle this project, when the cooler weather starts (help would be appreciated). The cost would be around \$400.

Tony will check on prices to redo the floor in the dining hall.

Ralph & Tom will be trimming the Weeping Willow tree next to the church.

Tom and Tony recently checked out the sump pump outside and agreed it should be replaced; Tom will purchase a new one – approximately \$150.

Pastor Jim will be participating in the Community Service at the Kendall Gazebo on Sunday, Aug. 20.

Pastor Jim will give a special service on the importance of supporting the church financially, by means of tithes and offerings, on September 24. A notice of this service will be sent out to the congregation in the September Newsletter, hoping that everyone will realize the importance of this matter.

The Trustees approved Pastor Jim's request for taking his vacation starting August 27 – September 17. He will be asking a few candidates to fill in for him during this time.

The next meeting will be September 13 at 7:30 pm.

The meeting closed with prayer at 7:45 pm

To all Morton Baptist Church Congregation Members:

On Sunday, September 24, Pastor Jim's Sermon will be focused on how to continue to do the Lord's work and our Ministry at MBC through tithing and gift giving. In order to explain why this sermon is so important to doing God's work, the trustees have prepared the following letter for you to read and understand prior to Pastor Jim's sermon. If you have any questions about its content, contact any trustee or myself. I have included my contact information in the letter below.

Dear Members and Friends,

The Board of Trustees are in the process of formalizing a budget for 2018. The Church is in a transition that many may not be aware of. Several members of our Church have either passed away, have retired or are relocating from the Morton area post retirement. As the Trustees prepare for 2018 and beyond, we did an analysis of how these changes may impact expected income for 2018. Below, I summarized the situation we will be facing as a Congregation in 2018. It is critical that each Congregation member read the following summary:

## **Current Situation:**

- 1. There are 28 families or individuals who are listed as those who contribute financially to support the church. Of the 28, Only 23 actually give money and only 9 individuals make a formal pledge each year totaling about \$46,000 / yr.:
  - a. 1 family pledges over \$5,000 a year
  - b. 4 families pledge or give between \$3,000 \$4,999 a year
  - c. 14 families pledge or give between \$1,000 and \$2,999 a year
  - d. 4 families pledge or give less than \$1,000 a year
- 2. 5 of the families or individuals above give over \$21,000 of the \$46,000 pledged (46% of Income).
- 3. Loose money (or Unpledged Income): \$8,000 / yr.
- 4. Fund Raising Income: \$8,500 / yr.
- 5. Building Use Income: \$2,500 / yr.
- 6. Mission Income: \$70 / yr.
- 7. Special Offering Income: \$2,000 / yr.
- 8. Total Income minus the Nursery School: Approximately \$67000
- 9. About \$65,000 in Endowment Fund gains have been moved to the Checking account to supplement the short fall in giving so budget can be met.

## 2018 Expected Situation:

- 1. Income from Pledged and Loose or Unpledged donations are expected to drop between \$4,500 \$7,000 due to changes in individuals ability to give to the Church
- 2. The expected budget is still being worked on, but will be about \$75,000 \$76,500.
- 3. <u>Early indications is that without the Endowment Fund gains supplementing the yearly budget, we will have a shortfall of between \$8,000 \$9,500</u>

- 4. The Endowment Fund was created by bequeaths to the Morton Baptist Church and the sale of the Parsonage. The estate of Tom Timmerman left MBC \$100,000, the estate of Dorthea Maiubaum left MBC \$25,000 and more recently the estate of Jim Bliss left MBC \$12,675. Without these generous bequeaths, the Church could not sustain itself financially.
- 5. The current Endowment Fund Balance is approximately \$115,000. It would last 7 10 years if we started supplementing current expenses with principle from the endowment fund. This would be dependent on any major building repair expense. Once this fund is depleted, the Church would have to shut its doors.
- 6. IF the endowment fund balance was around \$300,000, most of this amount could be put into an account that would pay about 6% (\$18,000 / yr.) interest. The extra income would also more than make up the current shortfall and preserve the principle.

So far in 2017, the capital expenditures and repairs for the Church have been close to \$7,000 due to the steeple and McQueen Hall exit door repair, replacement of sump pumps, lights and painting. The Trustees did use \$5,600 in Endowment Fund profits to pay for this work. The Trustees also took \$6,500 in profits from the Endowment Fund gains to help pay for ongoing monthly expenses to run the Church. The monthly donations, both pledged and unpledged, continue to be less than what is needed to operate the Church on an ongoing basis.

The Trustees continue to make thoughtful decisions on how to spend and invest the funds available to them to keep the Church operational and in excellent physical shape. The fact is that we have cut every line item in the budget during the past 3 - 4 years by changing vendors, negotiating lower rates with suppliers, insulating the building, delaying payment of salaries till the end of the month, etc. The budget is really modest for a building of this size and there are no other areas we know of to cut expenses. Salaries and salary related items account for over 70% of the total operating budget for the Congregation. We have not been able to give raises to our hard working employees for several years now. The equation is rather simple...either we increase income or we have to lower expenses. As a congregation, we need to decide how we want to serve the Lord and where we want to serve Him from.

The Trustees will do their best to estimate the budget for 2018. It is difficult to do with energy costs and winter plowing being difficult to predict. The Trustees appreciate your thoughtful consideration to fund the Church expenses as you decide if and how much you wish to pledge for the next year. It will be helpful if you could make a pledge so the Trustees have a better idea what the shortfall in income may be. I am sure that the generous nature that the congregation of Morton Baptist Church has displayed in the past will once again come through to fulfill the needs that the Church faces in the future.
