

ANOTHER NEW YEAR; still, a repeat of the past, Resolutions made, but none of them last. "I'm going to do better; I'm going to be strong; Last year I failed 'cause the year was too long." This is the truth; no more inventions, 'Cause the road to hell is paved with good intentions.

Why do we, in all sincerity, make promises, or resolutions, or plans, (schemes?) and not keep them; or modify them so the burden is lighter? Perhaps it is because we do not know our own nature. But God does, and He addresses the problem in Jeremiah 17:9, where He says, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; who can know it?

There is so much deceit in the world we become accustomed to it to the point that we deceive ourselves many times. However, there is a way to combat such deceit so our resolutions, plans, and promises do not turn out to be schemes.

To be truthful about everything in life, we must turn to the God of the universe because He already knows: "I, the LORD, search the heart, I test the conscience, even to give every man according to his ways, and according to the fruit of his doings" (Jeremiah 17:10).

If we go to the Bible and read to find His will for our lives, He will reveal His will to us, for He said, "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you," saith the Lord, "Thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end. Much of the time we put our heart and soul into a career or other things in life, only to have our interests change, resources dry up, the career dry up (Kodak?), or we get too old to participate in such endeavors; and these are only temporal things. If we seek God *first*, we are investing in things eternal, which things will never run out because God is forever.

In Matthew 6:25-34 Jesus addresses the cure for care about the world's goods, and in verses 32-33 He nails it right down to the basics: "For after all these things do the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But <u>seek ye first</u> the kingdom of God, and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you."

Read the Bible daily, pray often to thank God for His presence, and worship Him in the name of Jesus Christ. What a wonderful way to begin the new year of 2016, walking through life with the God who created you, the Son who redeemed you, and the Holy Spirit who dwells within you. Rejoice ever more!
