SUPERVISOR'S REMARKS

The Lions' Club Tree Lighting, the school's supper with Santa and the Community Band performance are scheduled for December 6^{th} .

A press conference was held regarding reducing the speed limit near the high school. Senator Ortt, Assemblyman Hawley, school, town, and county legislator representatives attended. Bills are in the Senate and Assembly to allow local approval of speed limit changes in school zones. Residents are encouraged to send letters in support of these bills.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Trudy Slocum, Lakeshore Road – asked how the priority of future water districts is set. Supervisor Cammarata said the ones currently established should be started in the Spring, then West Kendall Road will be next. After that, LaBella Associates (Engineer for the Town) will help determine the areas with the greatest chance of obtaining grants and low cost loans, based on need, users' incomes, and population density.

Mrs. Slocum asked if the "user" is the owner of the property or the resident of the property, for instance at the tenant housing.

Supervisor Cammarata said it is the taxpayer for the property whose income would be considered. Attorney Meier added that without grant funding, public water would be cost prohibitive, and disallowed by the NYS Comptroller.

Mrs. Slocum suggested that if a district were drawn to include more homes, those higher incomes could be offset and spread, to allow grant funding. The farm tenant houses are required to have water filtration systems. Does this weigh in toward need?

Councilwoman Szozda said the quality of the water is a criterion of eligibility for grants and low interest loans. Well testing is a preliminary step in the process of determination.

Supervisor Cammarata said there are many agencies and rules involved. If Mrs. Slocum would like to continue this discussion, Supervisor Cammarata will meet with her.
