An estimate for tree trimming in Beechwood Cemetery has been submitted. The bid was reviewed and approved by the Board. Scheduling should be done as soon as possible because the trees and limbs are hazardous.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Schuth made the following motion, seconded by Councilwoman Szozda:

RESOLUTION 45-0411 SEQR FOR ESTABLISHING LOCAL LAW #1 OF 2011 Revisions to the Town of Kendall Zoning Regulations within Hamlet, Waterfront Development and Waterfront residential Zones

It is hereby resolved that, in accordance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) regulations, the Town Board of the Town of Kendall announces its intent to serve as lead agency to conduct an environmental review as it relates to the establishment of Local Law #1 of the year 2011, which will consider adoption of Revisions to the Town of Kendall Zoning Regulations within Hamlet, Waterfront Development and Waterfront residential Zones.

Be it further resolved that the Town Board has determined that the proposed Local Law is an "Unlisted Action", as defined under SEQR, and...

Be it further resolved that the Town Board, in its capacity as Lead Agency, has prepared an environmental assessment of the significance of and potential environmental impact of the above listed action and declares that it will not result in any major impacts, and therefore will not cause damage to the environment. A Negative Declaration under SEQR is therefore issued for this action, and...

Be it further resolved that this SEQR action and declaration is to be forwarded along with this resolution to the Orleans County Planning Board for its review of Local Law #1 and filed with the Town Clerk as is appropriate for the official record of establishment of Local Law #1.

Supervisor Gaesser called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Councilman Joseph made the following motion, seconded by Councilman Pritchard:

RESOLUTION 46-0411 INTRODUCING LOCAL LAW 1 OF 2011: Revisions to the Town of Kendall Zoning Regulations within HAMLET, WATERFRONT DEVELOPMENT AND WATERFRONT RESIDENTIAL ZONES

Be it RESOLVED, that the Kendall Town Board introduces Local Law 1 of 2011 entitled *Revisions to the Town of Kendall Zoning Regulations within HAMLET, WATERFRONT DEVELOPMENT AND WATERFRONT RESIDENTIAL ZONES*, as attached, for consideration by the Town Board and to allow for public input and Orleans County Planning Board comment, and,

Be it further RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is authorized to place a Legal Notice for a Public Hearing to consider adoption of this law, to be held on May 3, 2011 at 7:30 p.m., in the Kendall Town Hall, 1873 Kendall Road, Kendall, New York 14476 at which time all persons wishing to be heard in favor of or in opposition thereto will be heard; and,

Be it further RESOLVED, that the text of this local law will be available at the Kendall Town Clerk's Office for public inspection, and posted on the town website for public inspection.

Discussion: Councilman Schuth reiterated that this is still in draft format, pending further recommendations of Attorney Sansone, the County Planning Board, the Town Board and public input.

Councilman Pritchard made the following motion, seconded by Councilman Schuth:

RESOLUTION 47-0411 INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT

Whereas, the Town of Carlton desires to extend municipal water service to its residents on Transit Road north of Carr Road on its border with the Town of Kendall, and,

Whereas, the Town of Carlton desires to include the Kendall residents along the east side of this road as out-ofdistrict users, and,

Whereas, both Town of Carlton and Town of Kendall residents will benefit from this project, and

Whereas, the Town of Kendall's participation should improve the Town of Carlton's probability of being awarded a grant for this project,

Now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, that the Town of Kendall desires to enter into an intermunicipal agreement with the Town of Carlton with the goal to extend municipal water service to residents on Transit Road north of Carr Road, and,

Be it further RESOLVED, to authorize Supervisor Gaesser to execute said agreement subject to attorney approval.

Discussion:

Councilman Pritchard offered to contact MCWA for a response in writing to this proposal. Legislator Rush said he has been informed that there are currently no grants available for these projects, and that the Town of Carlton is aware of this, and will be including the option of seeking low interest loans to proceed. An amendment to this resolution was suggested by Councilman Pritchard. The words "/low interest loan" will be inserted after the word grant.

Councilman Pritchard motioned to amend the resolution to incorporate this, seconded by Councilman Schuth.

Supervisor Gaesser called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Councilwoman Szozda made the following motion, seconded by Councilman Pritchard:

RESOLUTION 48-0411 AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH MUSIC THEATRE INTERNATIONAL FOR ROYALTY AND RENTAL OF MATERIAL

Whereas, the Town of Kendall desires to include performances of *The Music Man* as part of its 2012 Bicentennial celebrations, and,

Whereas, royalties and materials must be obtained to carry out these performances from Music Theatre International,

Now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, to authorize Supervisor Gaesser to execute an agreement with Music Theatre International for said royalties and materials, subject to attorney approval.

Discussion: Supervisor Gaesser has met with Mary Campbell on this. Negotiations resulted in this deal. This will be a free to the public Bicentennial celebration event.

Supervisor Gaesser called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Supervisor Gaesser made the following motion, seconded by Councilman Joseph:

RESOLUTION 49-0411 BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS FOR BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

Whereas, an agreement with Music Theatre International has been authorized, and payment for royalties and materials for performances of *The Music Man* as part of our 2012 Bicentennial celebrations is necessary at this time, and,

Whereas, a reserve fund was established to accumulate monies for payment of our 2012 Bicentennial celebrations,

Now, therefore, be it resolved, to make the following budget adjustments:

Transfer \$400 from account A888 Reserve for Celebration to account A5031 Interfund Transfers, and,

Increase account A7550.4 Celebrations Contractual from \$600 to \$1000.

Supervisor Gaesser called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Councilman Schuth made motion to pay the claims as listed on Abstract 4, seconded by Councilman Joseph. All ayes; motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Water Feasibility Report

Councilman Joseph suggested setting a time to discuss this report and to formulate a letter to the interested residents as to what steps are being taken, and to outline the proper order of steps. Supervisor Gaesser said that if grant money is not available, and low interest loans may take up to five years to procure, the emphasis needs to be on following the steps necessary to have the areas "shovel-ready", so that when funds do become available, we can act. A letter to the potentially affected residents on Carr Road will be drafted seeking opinions on being included in the Carlton water district. This will done by the end of the week.
