#### **RESOLUTION 102-608 Resolution Introducing Local Law #1 of 2008**

Whereas it has been deemed necessary to provide for Amendment to the Town of Kendall Zoning Ordinance Regulating Wind Energy Conversion Systems to both authorize and control their employment and the purposes for same, and...

Whereas the Kendall Town Planning Board has researched, evaluated, created and provided a recommendation in the form of a draft document entitled

Amendment to the Town of Kendall Zoning Ordinance Regulating Wind Energy Conversion Systems for a Local Law which addresses the requirements for zoning controls and the interests of the residents of the Town of Kendall as outlined within, now therefore...

These draft regulations, as attached, are hereby introduced for consideration by the Kendall Town Board and to allow for public input. A Public Hearing is to be set for August 14 at 7:30 PM. The Town Clerk is to make the text of this recommendation and additions to Local Law available at the Town Offices for public inspection.

## RESOLUTION 103-608 SEQR FOR ESTABLISHING LOCAL LAW #1 OF 2008 AMENDMENT TO THE TOWN OF KENDALL ZONING ORDINANCE REGULATING WIND ENERGY CONVERSION SYSTEMS

It is hereby resolved that, in accordance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) regulations, the Town Board of the Town of Kendall announces its intent to serve as lead agency to conduct an environmental review as it relates to the establishment of Local Law #1 of the year 2008, which will govern the Amendment to the Town of Kendall Zoning Ordinance Regulating Wind Energy Conversion Systems.

Be it further resolved that this SEQR EAF short form is to be forwarded along with this resolution to the Orleans County Planning Board for its review of Local Law #1 and filed with the Town Clerk as is appropriate for the official record of establishment of Local Law #1.

And, further that this waiver shall cover an area ¼ mile South and East of the intersection of Kenmor and Kendall Roads.

Councilwoman Szozda moved the following, seconded by Councilman Schuth:

### RESOLUTION 107-608 FAIR HOUSING/ANTI-DISPLACEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, the Town of Kendall, State of New York, has made application for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds from the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 519 of Public Law 101-144, the HUD Appropriations Act requires certain statement of assurances and certifications;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to the Town of Kendall being granted CDBG funds by the State; the Town of Kendall, by administrative act, does adopt Fair Housing and Anti-Displacement Plans for the Town.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Board appoints Daniel Gaesser\_to serve as the Fair Housing Officer for the Town of Kendall.

Supervisor Gillman called for a vote, which resulted in all ayes. Motion carried.

Councilman Joseph moved the following, seconded by Councilwoman Szozda:

RESOLUTION 108-608 DISPOSAL AND DONATION OF OUT-DATED COMPUTER (AND RELATED) EQUIPMENT

Whereas the Town has a duty and obligation to provide security for the court officers, and citizens, and...

With the recommendation of both Town Justices, be it resolved that the Town Board of Kendall authorize the Supervisor to enter into a one (1) year contract with the Wackenhut Corporation for the purpose of providing a Court Officer.

Discussion: Councilman Gaesser stated that this will be \$100/month.

Supervisor Gillman called for a vote, which resulted in all ayes. Motion carried.

Councilman Schuth moved the following, seconded by Councilwoman Szozda:

#### **RESOLUTION 110-608**

It is resolved that the Kendall Town Board approve, pending written agreement between the property owners and the Town Board, the placement of Welcome Signs on the properties currently owned by Bob and Jane Hart of Kendall Road, and Butch and Cindy Christ of Petersmith Road. The signs are to be designed as previously approved, and placed appropriately for the property conditions.
