OLD BUSINESS

Water Expansion- Course of Action Plan

Water survey results – there are still 57 surveys not returned, after a second mailing. For several roads, the outstanding replies may sway the results of whether water lines can be pursued. Proper mapping cannot be done without more responses. Many factors go into mapping and agricultural exemptions and multiple contingent vacant parcels must be coded, as well as each respondent's answers.

Door to door surveying must be the next step to try to obtain more responses. Each remaining household must be visited personally. Parts of roads which do have high density and enough positive responses could be done in segments with other areas.

Councilman Joseph will provide the names of the outstanding property owners.

Re-zoning RA (residential agriculture) districts with water service to RR (rural residential) Codification needs updating, and changing, and all needs to be reviewed by the county.

With an aggressive plan, there may be a timing issue in being able to complete this by year end. There are "allowed use" and some jurisdiction issues to be clarified.

Kendall Medical Center

Strong Hospital is buying Lakeside Hospital, but is not buying the Kendall center. There are deed issues to be resolved.

NEW BUSINESS

Supervisor Gaesser will contact those necessary to arrange the street dance.

With no further business coming before the Board, Councilman Schuth motioned for adjournment, seconded by Councilman Joseph; all ayes. Meeting adjourned at 9:05 p.m.
