WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Highway Superintendent of the Town of Kendall to purchase a 1998 MACK 10 Wheel Dump Truck Model No. RD6 VIN No. 1M2P264C4WM026033 with snow removal accessories to supplement the fleet of vehicles necessary to maintain roads throughout the Town of Kendall; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Oakfield has declared the above-described truck to be surplus equipment; and,

WHEREAS, due to its condition, features, mileage and future use potential, the purchase of this vehicle for \$40,000 would be a considerable value, and constitute a cost savings to the Town of Kendall as compared to an equivalent vehicle with similar mileage, condition and features; so,

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED, that Town of Kendall Board approves the purchase of the truck and accessories from the Town of Oakfield for use by the Town of Kendall Highway Department.

Whereas, the Town Board conducted a public hearing to consider adoption of proposed Local Law #1 of the year 2013 on September 3, 2013 and September 17, 2013 in the Kendall Town Hall, 1873 Kendall Road, Kendall, NY 14476, at which time all persons wishing to be heard in favor or in opposition thereto were heard,

Now, therefore be it resolved that Local Law #1 of 2013 of the Town of Kendall, Orleans County, New York, being a local law entitled "Revisions to the Town of Kendall Zoning Regulations within Rural Agriculture, Waterfront Residential and Rural Residential Zones" be adopted; and
