SUPERVISOR'S REMARKS

This has been the busiest month in several years. The foreclosure proceedings on the Eagle Creek Marina are complete. The mortgage company was the only bidder, and is now the owner. All liens, including the town's lien against the property were set aside, by law. Supervisor Gaesser contacted the New York State Office of Community Renewal, the agency which administers the \$562,000 Economic Development Grant. The report to them is still due in January, and that agency will contact the town as to how it will proceed.

There have been break-ins to the coin-operated water dispenser at the Highway Department. Orleans County Chief Deputy Sheriff Drennan has informed Highway Superintendent Kruger and Supervisor Gaesser that the crimes have been solved and charges are pending. The town has received restitution and reimbursement for the dead bolt lock which was damaged.

The potential development of Troutburg has led to the discovery of the serious oversight of a local law passed in 1990, which makes the town the lead agency for the coastal erosion hazard area. Tonight, administrators will be named to comply with this regulation.

A website, neighborsoftroutburg.com, has been launched, with many inaccuracies and much misinformation. Supervisor Gaesser invited the publisher or web master of this site to meet and discuss the topics and gain accurate information.

The town is running under budget, and will exceed projected revenues, mainly due to mortgage tax. The Hunt Library Trust Fund certificate of deposit (CD) renewed November 12th, for five years at 1.73%, which will help the library budgets.

Boards

Planning Board – P. Gray, Chair

The Planning Board is reviewing the zoning codes in anticipation of an application from the Wegman Group regarding Troutburg, but has not received an application or site plan as of yet. The workload in the coming year on the boards will be very heavy and detailed due to the potential development of Troutburg, and the potential change of use of Eagle Creek Marina. Two meetings per month are likely.

The State has sent the funds which were expected.

The radio system county-wide is outdated and less than functional. Replacement plan is being discussed.

CORRESPONDENCE

9 copies of one form letter from 8 Norway Heights residents and one Banner Beach resident. Letter from Melanie Whitehair re. DEC visit to the Salvation Army Camp and coastal erosion concerns.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Supervisor Gaesser extended the invitation to public comment. Any concerns which cannot be addressed will be researched.

Al Lofthouse had questions on four vouchers, which were answered by the Board. Mr. Lofthouse observed that it is sad that so few came during the budget hearings to have input on where tax dollars are spent, while there are so many tonight.

Keith Germano asked if zoning changes would be needed if the Salvation Army sale goes through. Supervisor Gaesser said possibly. The parcels are now two different zones – waterfront residential and waterfront development. This has been discussed, but is not known at this point. The town would be lead on this, but it would be referred to the county for their approval. The process has not begun.

Melanie Whitehair – thanked Supervisor Gaesser for the acknowledgement of the town's oversight in naming a Coastal Erosion Administrator. She expressed her concern for environmental damage done by the clearing which has already taken place on the Salvation Army site, and asked about possible repair to the bluffs.

Supervisor Gaesser responded that it is unknown if remediation is necessary. The DEC has offered assistance and advice as to coastal erosion issues. The code enforcement office will be the administrator handling these determinations.

Mrs. Whitehair said that the DEC expressed sadness that the Salvation Army can be fined for damage done, but was cautioned by Supervisor Gaesser to be cautious against hearsay, especially when discussing state agencies. The Board has requested any documentation of site visits to this area, including the "eagles' nest" investigation, but has not yet received any reports or documentation from the DEC. All information needs to be confirmed in writing before it is stated on the record at a public meeting.

Jerry Clement – Read a letter, which is attached to these minutes, outlining the concerns of the neighboring properties to Troutburg, and opinions and suggestions appearing on the neighborsoftroutburg.com website. Mr. Clement said some erroneous information has been corrected on this website, and asked that he be contacted if other corrections are needed.

Supervisor Gaesser corrected a misconception about the erection of model structures on the Troutburg site.

Mr. Germano – expressed that the people on Norway Heights are NOT against development of the Salvation Army property, but are wary of the proposed development, rather than residential housing.
