A Letter From The Pastor

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

January 21st marked the 5th anniversary of my ordination; all 5 years of my ordained ministry have been blessed to be at Concordia Lutheran church. I cannot express enough gratitude to the congregation, the church council and other leaders, my colleagues in ministry in Kendall and the Genesee Fingerlakes Conference of the Upstate NY Synod, Bishops Marie Jerge and John Macholz, my wife and family, and so many others. May God receive all the glory and thanks for these children of God who have journeyed with me! There are bits of that day that are a blur, overwhelmed with welcome and love. There are other moments indelibly etched in my memory. The same is true of the whole breadth of our time together at Concordia.

Some of the moments and ministries that remind me of God's love are:

- Long-time friend and Jewish Cantor, Leah Wolf-Pellingra singing, in Hebrew, the priestly blessing that Jews and Christian have been using for millennia, the same benediction we use each Sunday.
- Nervously fumbling the Words of Institution the first time as an ordained pastor and having to start over.
- So many Baptisms. I've had the joy of baptizing many children. I've baptized twins twice and a family of 3 children, from ages 3 months to 9 years (no adults, yet!).
- Singing "Hallelujah" for a Maundy Thursday service once to see it grow into a vital part of the way we worship and re-tell the story of Christ's sacrifice and resurrection.
- Working with 4 very different, very talented musicians. Jeremy Rath is beloved at Concordia and it's easy to see why. Beth Stella came and played at Concordia right when we needed her and worked diligently and patiently with us all through Lent and Holy Week. Being back in Western NY has brought working and worshipping with my mother, Lillian, back into my life in a way I never expected. God works in mysterious ways! And Jimmy Hartmann brings an energy and joy to my work and our worship that is uniquely touched by his God-given talents.
- Seeing children create Biblical stories out of Legos, remembering key details of the story,

and retelling the story months later with clarity and joy.

- Seeing our building buzzing with people working hard, bursting at the seams with God's children at events like: The Corned-Beef and Cabbage Dinner, Vacation Bible School, funerals, and the 125th anniversary celebration.
- The challenge and privilege of presiding at the funerals of people that I never met from familiess in need, of people that you have held dear for so many years, of people that showed me God's love the minute that I walked in the doors to Concordia, that same love that I tried to reflect to them in their dying hours and had the honor of proclaiming to their friends and family gathered to mourn and celebrate their earthly lives.

- Singing Silent Night by candlelight. The sight of all your faces, lit from below, as your voices carry the music of Christmas up to the ceiling. What a pretty country church we have!
- A solitary rose on the alter on Good Friday, all else stripped away in mourning and yet in hope.
- The outdoor ecumenical service each summer. Fr Mark's ability to enthrall the children, Pastor Sara's rousing, powerful voice, Pastor Jim's steady, grounded delivery of the Word, and Deacon Jonah's insistence that we are a community brought together by God's love, not divided by differences, ensuring that we shout Allelujah, Amen!! at what God has blessed us with.
- And so many more that I am remiss to omit. I might be out of room on the page but I would love to sit and recount many more with you!



It has been a blessed, surprising, challenging, energizing time to be your pastor these past 5 years. I give all thanks and praise to God for bringing us together.



Meeting opened at 7:05 p.m. with special needs and concerns shared.

Dorrie Hardenbrook made a motion to accept the agenda, seconded by Cathy Herman carried.

Nancy Comstock motioned to accept the December minutes, Russ Levett seconded, carried.

Election of Council Members: Beth Schmidt made a motion that Russ Levett for council president, Dorrie Hardenbrook for Vice President, Beth Schmidt for Secretary and Mary Lou Lockhart for Treasurer. Cathy Herman seconded the motion. All in favor, carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor will be on vacation the week of January 14-21. Pastor Frank Hanrahan will supply. Mutual Ministry has been in contact with Ann Elphick from St. John's Hamlin to talk about training session or two with our members and mobilizing them to do home visits to our shut-ins. Tentative plans are to do training and sign-ups with our members in late January. Pastor will discuss this at the annual meeting. There will be a pulpit swap February 25th. Pastor is going to Concord in Greece and Aileen Robbins from Messiah will be at Concordia.

There was some displeasure with the Christmas Eve Service. Pastor Steve does not think this is because of music selection. Many first time visitors on Christmas Eve and some people that occasionally come to Concordia were pleased with the service. Sunday service - 3, Special Events - Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Day services. Visitations - home-3, sick/hospital-1, shut-in-3, holiday-9, total 16 (0 inactive, 3 non-member), Meetings-4, Counselings-2, Weddings-0, Funeral-0

Finance Committee: Linda Kludt has stepped down from the finance committee.

Christian Education: They met earlier tonight and have planned the curriculum through Easter.

Mutual Ministry: Jimmy Hartmann signed the 2017 contract.

Property Committee: The kitchen renovation has been started. Alan Lambert is generating a list of things that need attention in and around the church. Alan will post them on the bulletin board for people to do the tasks.

Fellowship & Hospitality: Stone soup lunch at the annual meeting, January 22.

Worship and Music: The piano in the council room has been tuned.

Klafehn Estate Fund: There will need to be a vote at the congregational meeting for 2 members.

Cub Scouts: They area disorganized group. The boys were invited to be honor guard at the Amerks game and they did a great job.

Old Business: Jimmy Hartmann needs to be paid \$7800 for 2017. This is not how it is in the budget, so we need to let the congregation know at the annual meeting. Also the supply preacher pay needs to raise to \$125.00 plus mileage. So the new budgeted number is \$600.00

New Business: There is \$17,000 in the kitchen fund. This includes the money Russ and Lisa have saved from their years of chairing the Corn Beef Dinner and a \$10,000 donation. There seems to be a couple of disgruntled people not happy about renovations. The total cost of the renovation will be under \$5000.00

Beth Schmidt made a motion to spend not more than \$2500 for the flooring in the kitchen. Cathy Herman seconded the motion, all in favor, carried. Beth Schmidt made a motion to spend not more than \$2500 for the counter tops, sinks and painting. Cathy Herman seconded the motion, carried.

Building use for Dorrie Hardenbrook for an exercise group was approved. She would like to have exercise be a fund raiser. Pastor made the motion, Cathy Herman seconded, all in favor. Dorrie Hardenbrook made a motion for Jill Groves to use the building on February 18 for a shower, Cathy Herman seconded the motion, carried

Russ Levett made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Pastor Steve seconded the motion, carried. Meeting ended at 8:36 p.m.

Council President Report: Thank you Russ Levett for all that you do for Concordia. Russ was re-elected 2017 Council President.

Fellowship & Hospitality: They meet monthly and discuss what we can do at church to keep people connected. The wine and cheese event is being planned. Also plan on another Euchre Tournament. The committee is looking for ideas. *Bible Study:* All are invited to attend Friday mornings at 9:30 a.m.

Assisting Ministers: More people are welcome to assist during worship. You do not have to do anything but be a reader and come up to the altar just to read. Please see Charley Duschen.

Mutual Ministry: This is an active group that meets regularly with Pastor. If you have any questions, please see Charley Duschen, Jill Groves or Carol D'Agostino.

Memorial Fund: Reviewed

Worship & Music Report: Reviewed. They also have room for more members. They meet the first Tuesday of the month. *Klafehn Fund:* Reviewed. Norm St. John made a motion for Brigitte Duschen and Bob Lockhart to serve a second 3 year term each. Beth Provost seconded. All in favor, carried.

Property: Reviewed. Alan Lambert made a list of things that need to be done around the church. These things will be posted on the bulletin board so people can just do them. Russ Levett takes it upon himself to get things done around the church and find people to fix things if he can not do it himself. During a recent wind storm, the neighbor north of the parsonage had their trampoline fly into the parsonage. There is some damage to siding. A closet door was fixed in Pastor's office.

Christian Education/Youth Group: Going well. We need more teachers. Nancy Comstock did it twice in 2016 and says it is a great experience.

Nominating Committee: They could not find anyone interested in serving on Council. Cathy Herman volunteered at the December meeting.

Altar Care: Thank you everyone that serves, more people are needed and welcome, it takes about 2 hours total and can be done before church. See Jill Groves.

New Business:

Synod representatives: it is too early for anyone to know if they are available to go to the assembly. Craig Herman made a motion that Council choose who goes to the assembly. Gary Kludt seconded, carried.

Updates to the budget are needed. We need to raise our supply preacher pay to \$125.00 each Sunday plus mileage. So the new budget is \$600 for the year. Also the musician pay was not reported correctly and that raises just a couple hundred dollars to \$7800.00 for the year.

Visiting Ministry: Pastor Steve spoke about starting a visiting ministry at Concordia. Anne Elphick a former member of Concordia is now a Stevens Minister at St. John's in Hamlin. She has been educated/trained through the Stevens Ministry and is willing to come to Concordia to train those interested in visiting people how to do it properly. It would take 2 sessions.

Gary Kludt motioned to adjourn the meeting. Norm St. John seconded, carried. Meeting closed at 12:15 a.m. with prayer.
