A Letter From The Pastor

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

It is finally June and many things are wrapping up as others are just getting started. And so it is with some of the activities and projects here at Concordia. I wanted to take a little time to review some of the significant building projects over the past few months and also take a look forward and future improvement projects.

In August of 2016 Concordia had a major improvement when we finally paved the parking lot! By way of a generous donation from the Cater family we were able to pave the lot and save some money for future sealing and painting.

After years of collecting funds from the Corned Beef and Cabbage Dinner (a spectacular fund-raiser, fellowship time, and meal!) the kitchen got a face-lift! New flooring, countertops, sinks, light fixtures were installed and the room was painted. It's much brighter and functional; it was certainly time for an update.

Starting next Monday the roof on the sanctuary will be replaced. Each winter we were creeping closer and closer to needing to replace it. This past year was finally enough and we made the decision to do it this spring. We have been blessed that we will need to use much less of the Klafehn-Frobel Fund than initially expected. Concordia raised almost \$10,000 (only about \$800 short of our goal) through the generosity of its members, a and a few friends. Additionally, after the wind storm in early March did further damage to our roof we have received a check for over \$11,000, more than doubling our money towards the cost of the roof. Praise God for the generosity of the community and some good timing!

There are two other projects we are looking towards:

One is replacing some of the light fixtures in the upstairs hallways and office with efficient LED lamps. There are incentives from the electric company and the government to replace older light fixtures. There is an Eagle Scout project planned for the north entrance, to brighten and beautify the stairway. We are considering an update to the lighting throughout much of the upstairs to coincide with this.

The other project planned is to install a new television in the Fellowship Hall and a closed-circuit camera system in the Sanctuary so we can stream our services to the Fellowship Hall, as well as other functionalities of the TV set, for exercise groups, Christian Ed and Sunday School, Family Movie Nights, etc.

It is an exciting and sometimes intimidating time to be the church, to balance the responsibilities and possibilities of working together to serve the gospel and to be forward thinking about the future of Concordia Lutheran church. I encourage you to pray for Concordia and pray for the Spirit's Wisdom as we work together and look forward.
