“Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one! You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.

“And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.”

These are the marching orders for all of God's children, if they be Jews or Gentiles. God has promised blessings upon all who obey, and cursings for all who disobey. Hear what Jesus Christ, the Messiah, has to say in Matthew 5:17-20; “Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. For assuredly I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled. Whoever therefore breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

“For I say to you, that unless your righteousness exceeds the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven.”

The world in which we live is a mess in so many ways one hardly knows where to begin, but begin we shall.

Whatever happens in our society there are groups of people who gather in throngs to place the blame on someone else instead of looking in the mirror of life and recognizing the culprit staring back at them. Many years ago there was a cartoon strip with a possum and many other animal characters in it. One special one was where something bad happened in our society and the cartoon characters were reflecting us. They were searching for the culprit, and the possum declared, “We has found the enemy, and he is us!”

We, as a nation have turned away from the only real source of guidance that humanity has, and that is the one true God; the One who created the universe and all it contains. We have many thousands of churches in this nation, and in so many of these churches a social gospel is preached. That is, if the poor are enriched, if the homeless are fed, clothed and housed, the addicts are given clean needles, and replacement drugs that are safer, and we teach tolerance of aberrant behavior, and we have a justice system that truly is just, plus who knows what else, then the murder and other violence in our society will diminish.

Well, a couple of things happened recently (which has become the norm) that dispels such mythology. The first one happens to be not a poor person, but two very wealthy leaders in New York State. They were sent to prison on corruption charges; nothing unusual about that except for the fact they were even caught and prosecuted.

However, they are now going to appeal the verdict. The basis for the appeal? It seems no one has been able to clearly define *corruption!* Well, at least not in this case.

The other one is when a terrorist went into a night club and killed and wounded a record number of people;... did I write terrorist? The terrorist called 911 and told them his plans, and he called them again while he was still shooting up the place.

However, law enforcement agencies and the president were loath to call it an act of terrorism, and indeed, not *ISIS* or *Radical Islam*, when the terrorist in fact said he represented **ISIS!**

How far down the slippery slope of lies we have come as a nation! When the leadership of a nation refuses to call something by its proper name when the facts are presented to them, it is impossible to fight crime. There are a number of factors that propagate crime but the number one factor is not calling things as they really are and then dealing with it.

This brings us to the churches in North America. When the Gospel of Jesus Christ is watered down by teaching social activism the people have lost their way. When sin is called sin as the Bible describes sin, and the preachers tell the people they must repent and be saved in the name of Jesus Christ, it gives them direction for their lives here on earth and direction for eternity.

Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6, NKJV).

Well, that certainly is good direction, is it not? But there are those who would question the need of Jesus Christ in the first place.

Again, the Bible speaks: “He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, *because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God*” (John 3:18 NKJV).

All of mankind stands condemned before God, not because of what they have done but because they have a sin nature; it is natural to sin. If anyone does not believe the Scriptures are true, it is sin. When lawmakers make laws contrary to God’s word, it is sin. Sin makes the body restless so people find ways to compensate for what seems to be lacking. Most of the time the consequences are very negative.

The answer to all of the problems in this nation, or any other, is to turn to God and allow His Son, Jesus Christ, the Messiah, to take their sin away by His sacrificial death on the cross.

In Romans 7:24-8:1 the Bible says, “O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

“So then, with the mind I myself serve the law of God, but with the flesh the law of sin.

“There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.”

See how easy it is to walk through life with the God of the universe? Don’t keep Him waiting; YOU may run out of time.


