Meeting opened at 7:40pm

The Financial Report was reviewed. The Endowment Fund is up. The check from Jim Bliss's memorial was received, \$12,500 will be deposited into the Endowment Fund. All accounts are up to date. Gary made a motion to accept the Financial Report as written, Bev seconded.

The 2017 Budget is ready for review at the Annual Meeting.

Gary House will do an in-house audit of the financials, on December 19, 2016.

The Stewardship letter was in the December newsletter.

It was agreed that in lieu of monetary Christmas gifts to Church Committee members that the money would be donated to the Youth Group. Dale will present the check on Sunday, December 18, 2016.

Ralph received a bill from Pat Seaman for \$550 for mowing for 2016.

The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed. Ralph, Jim Richardson and Dan Cater will replace the fans in the sanctuary. Gary made a motion to accept the minutes, Bev seconded.

The church was inspected by the Fire Inspector. Signs that say "Fire Extinguisher" need to be posted above fire extinguishers. Emergency lights need to be replaced. CO detectors have been installed. The inspector will return in March to re-inspect.

Tom Ingraham and Gary House have agreed to be the emergency contacts if there was a 911 call regarding the church.

Nominating Committee – Tom Ingraham and Sandy Strassenburgh have agreed to be Trustees. Ralph and Brad Miller will be on the Pastoral Committee, there is still an opening for a female church member on the committee. We need two Deacons and someone for the Kitchen Committee.

Meeting was closed with prayer at 8:05 pm

night.


