

"The days of our lives are seventy years; and if by reason of strength they are eighty years, yet their boast is only labor and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away" (Psalm 90:10).

However, there is no guarantee that anyone will live to be any certain age. As we see on the news and in our personal observation, things such as drunk drivers, foggy mornings, street shootings, opioid overdose, terrorists, and natural phenomena all take their toll. And age-wise they are non-selective.

The Bible says, "So teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12).

Wisdom is looking at life from God's point of view. That point of view is found in the Holy Bible and nowhere else. God will open our understanding to His word as we read it with the intention of being obedient to what we have read. Even if you have a memory that is as leaky as mine there will be enough Scripture that sticks to the inside walls of your head to allow the Holy Spirit to make use of it. But He will not use what you have not read.

So; what are you going to do with the days you have left? Are you going to use them with the wisdom God offers you? Or just go your own self-absorbed way? God has made us in His image, and our lives should be a reflection of His image. God has created us to worship and serve Him so other people will see the love of God that brought salvation to us through Jesus Christ. Each day we live should be a spiritual adventure to advance the knowledge of Christ in the world. If we do not have the knowledge of Christ in us we have nothing to offer other people that is worth having because it will stop when we or they leave this earth; and our days are being used up.

With that thought in mind, I am reminded to number my days as this June will be number seventy-six for me. Since this is true, I do not have very many months of June to confront me.

So what shall I do? I shall seek God's face each day and gain a heart of wisdom. Wisdom from God's point of view dictates that I obey what I have just read: Jesus said, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen (Matthew 28:18-20).

According to John 3:3 we must be born again. If you are born again then Matthew 28:18-20 are your marching orders in this life.

John 3:18 says, "He who believes in Him (Jesus) is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

To not believe means to not confess your sin to God and ask forgiveness for that sin in the name of Jesus Christ. It does not mean you are unaware of what Jesus did to provide salvation. It means you are trying to do things and behave in a manner that is acceptable to God without the shed blood of Christ making atonement for you.

In John 14:6 Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

That means there is no possible way to be accepted into God's presence except through Jesus Christ. Here is God's offer: "But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast" (Ephesians 2:4-9).

Would you not be willing to share such a gift that has eternal value? That is new life in Christ and it is free to each of us. And you remember the condemnation expressed in John 3:18? With the new birth the condemnation is gone: "There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit" (Romans 8:1).

#### **Braille Volunteers Needed**

Do you enjoy perusing the bookshelves in your local bookstore or library, looking for your favorite author, or new bestseller? This is a pleasure not shared with people who are blind. Less than 5% of all reading material is available to the blind in Braille. The Lions Club of Spencerport offers a free, 9month course to learn to transcribe Braille; (there is a nominal fee for software and materials). Once you have completed the course, you are eligible to

become a certified transcriber by the Library of Congress. You can then work at home transcribing requested reading materials by the blind, including fiction, non-fiction, textbooks, cookbooks, etc. You will meet weekly with the entire Braille group in Spencerport to submit your completed work, and assist in proofreading others' work. This is a fascinating language to learn, and helps to share the gift of reading with those who do not readily have it. We would love to have you join us!
