Last month, Rev. David Higgs and his wife, Barbara, worshipped with us here. It was a delight to meet them and for them to see old friends. Rev. Higgs talks about his time here and about the wood paneling that graces the front of the sanctuary. When he arrived the front of the church was bare and rather plain, so funds were raised to purchase the new paneling and to do that one of the first harvest suppers was held. That is one example of the ways our church responded to needs and opportunities over the years. While looking at the paneling the other day, I noticed a memorial name plaque on the hymn number sign. This is a memorial to a young military officer who lost his life in World War II. There are many memorial name plaques in our church. These remind us not only of loved ones who have died, but the generosity of those who gave a memorial gift. Loved ones remembered are also significant as we see the memorial wall in MacQueen Hall. More than just names, these were those who were a part of us. Some may be a distant name from long ago or more recent church members and friends; however, all were those whose lives impacted the church and community. What mattered was that they lived their faith, used their gifts and made a difference in the legacy of Morton Baptist Church.

History is important because it has shaped us. We have a substantial history as we proudly declare on our Sunday bulletin, "For the Glory of God and the Advancement of His Kingdom Founded/Established 1832". There is a lot more that has gone on before us that still impacts our ways. Any look at a church's history will have surprises and insights; we will find some positive times and some that were difficult and challenging. We need all of that to get a complete picture and understanding of who we are. As a former history teacher, I believe history is so much more than names and dates. Those can easily be looked up. What matters in history is seeing what motivated people, what impacted a church or community, what challenges were met or what blessings and significant times meant to those involved. Our history is a touchstone to see where our foundation lay and a true perspective from where we look forward.

With history in mind, and as part of my intentional pastoral work, we are going to explore our history together on Sunday, September 30th after the worship service. Everyone is invited to be a part of this time. The plan is to have a working lunch and then to spend time together to explore our history. We will then put together the information we have gathered and make it part of the information the pastoral search committee will need. This is the first of our three Fifth Sunday Meetings. We'll have another one on December 30th to look at community and congregation demographics and a third on March 31st to look toward the future and God's vision for Morton Baptist Church.


MBC Country Mouse follows the Kendall School schedule for vacation days. Classes begin in September and finish in early June.

Class size is limited to 20 children, but usually average about 10 - 12. In addition to the teacher, each class has one to two adult/parent helpers.

TUITION

After an initial registration fee, (\$218) for the three day program, \$145 for two day program), tuitions are due in three equal installments (\$218) for the three day program, (\$145 for the two day program) on the 15th of September, November, January, and March. \$872 Three day program Total \$580 Two day program Total

One day "Mom" and Me program is a pay as you come for \$5.00 per visit.



Daily schedules are designed to encourage learning, independence, socialization, creativity, and self esteem.

The curriculum for our daily programs is designed to be a positive first learning experience. Emphasis is placed on social development as your child learns to work and play with a group of his/her peers. Students are given the opportunity to experience a variety of creative activities (painting, cutting, clay play), singing, story, and show n' share circle times, large muscle activities, sand table and free play.

In addition, our program strives to helps your child with pre-kindergarten readiness skills. Activities are provided to allow growth in fine motor skills, listening skills, language development, and pre-reading skills. The love of reading is encouraged by daily story times, and by our take home a library book program. Creative art activities, cooking, singing, group games are frequently planned. Social development continues to be fostered as opportunities are given to work and play with others.



STAFF

MBC Country Mouse Nursery School is staffed by one teacher, Diane Grimm, and one to two adult parent aides.

Diane Grimm has taught at Country Mouse for over 25 years. She is a graduate of SUNY Geneseo, and completed her graduate work at SUNY Brockport. She is certified to teach nursery school through sixth grade, and has specialized in Early Childhood Education.



Local field trips and special visitors are periodically arranged during the year to further broaden their experiences and learning.

Holiday parties, an end of the year picnic, and graduation and move up ceremonies are scheduled for both the three and four day programs.
