SUPERVISOR'S REMARKS

The informational meeting regarding a switch in street lighting to Light Emitting Diodes (LED) for all lighting districts was well attended and informative.

The informational meeting regarding a plan to furnish public water to all the remaining unserved residents was well attended. Many spoke in favor of the plan. None who spoke were opposed. This will be a huge undertaking. The first step will be a widespread confidential income survey being administered by the LaBella engineering firm.

PRESENTATION ABOUT RADIO TOWER

Dale Banker and Tim Warth from the Orleans County Office of Emergency Management presented information about planned radio towers to be erected to improve emergency radio reliability and response, and eliminate deficient areas. One area chosen as a potential site for one of these towers is behind the Kendall Fire Hall. Holley and Lyndonville also have planned sites. Homeland Security has promised grant money to make these projects feasible. As this process emerges, public input will be solicited. Public safety communication would be enhanced. The Kendall Fire Department is in favor of this.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilwoman Flow made the following motion, which was seconded by Councilwoman Szozda:

RESOLUTION 40-0119 RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A CAPTIAL RESERVE TO BE KNOWN AS THE HIGHWAY MACHINERY, EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLE RESERVE FUND

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Kendall has determined it to be responsible and necessary to establish a reserve fund pursuant to section 6-c of the New York General Municipal Law for inevitable purchase or replacement of highway machinery, equipment and vehicles to facilitate future financial planning for the Town and to avoid the cost and expense of bonding for the complete cost of such purchases.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Town Board of Kendall:

Pursuant to Section 6-c of the New York General Municipal Law, there is hereby established a capital reserve fund to be known as the Highway Machinery, Equipment and Vehicle Reserve Fund.

The purpose of the reserve fund established by this Resolution is to accumulate moneys to finance the cost of machinery, equipment, and vehicles to be used for any and all purposes that the Highway Department requires to perform its service to the Kendall community including constructing, reconstructing, repairing and maintaining streets and highways or any other physical betterment or improvement.

The chief financial officer of the Town of Kendall is hereby directed to deposit and secure the moneys of this reserve fund in the manner provided by Section 10 of the General Municipal Law. The financial officer may invest the moneys in the reserve fund in the manner provided by Section 11 of the General Municipal Law and consistent with the investment policy of the Town of Kendall. Any interest earned or capital gains realized on the moneys so deposited or invested shall accrue and become part of the reserve fund established by the Resolution. The financial officer shall account for the reserve fund in a manner which maintains the separate identity of the reserve fund and shows the date and amount of each sum paid into the fund, interest earned by the fund, capital gains or losses, the amount and date of each withdrawal from the fund and total assets of the fund. The Town Board will render a detailed report at the end of each fiscal year. Except as otherwise provided by law, expenditures from the reserve fund established by this Resolution shall be made only for the purpose for which the reserve fund is established. No expenditures shall be made from this reserve fund without the approval of the Town Board and such additional actions or proceedings as may be required by Section6-c of the General Municipal Law, the provisions of the Local Finance Law, or any other law, including a permissive referendum if required by subdivision 4 of Section 6-c of the General Municipal Law or any other law.

This Resolution is hereby adopted subject to a permissive referendum.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, which resulted in all ayes -3, with 2 members absent. Supervisor Cammarata declared the motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Petersmith Road petitions for rezoning to general business.

It is the Board's decision to move forward with this. Paperwork will be referred and forwarded to the Planning Board, and the County Planning Board. The Planning Board has begun its review, and is initially in support of the change to zoning of this area.

The Town Board wishes to refer the communications tower placement discussed at the presentation to the Planning Board, but was advised by the CEO and the Attorney that the project is in its infancy stages, and any steps taken by the Town would be premature.

Planning Chairman Kludt asked if the intention of the Town Board is to expand public water to all those currently without. Supervisor Cammarata said ideally, yes, if the threshold of affordability (according to the State Comptroller regulations) can be maintained. Councilwoman Szozda said much will depend on grant issuance and costs.

With no further business coming before the Board, Councilwoman Flow made a motion to adjourn. Motion seconded by Councilwoman Szozda; all ayes. Meeting adjourned by Supervisor Cammarata at 8:08 p.m.
