RESOLUTION 114-1118 INCREASE BOND COUNSEL CONTRACT FOR WATER DISTRICT SEVEN

WHEREAS, in 2016 the Town entered into a contract with Hodgson Russ to provide bond counsel services for Water District No. 7, and

WHEREAS, the Town issued additional Bond Anticipation Notes (BAN) that were not included in the anticipated costs in that contract, and

WHEREAS, Hodgson Russ has requested an increase of \$3,500 in the bond counsel contract,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Kendall authorizes an increase of \$3,500 in the bond counsel contract, from \$12,000 to \$15,500, with a corresponding decrease in the Water District Seven Contingency Account.
