

What's Next?

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witness in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. Acts 1:8

One of the interesting things we see in the resurrection accounts in the gospels is that the disciples are truly at a loss as to what is next for them. We are those who know Him, know the story and live a new and resurrected life. As I write this article, I'm still on an Easter high. It was a privilege and joy to celebrate Holy Week and Easter Sunday worship with you. I'm excited about what is next for us all.

TRUSTEE MTG 4-17-19

In attendance: Gary House, Dan Cater, Tony Callari, Frank Hoffman, Tom Ingraham, Rev. Walter Steenson, Marilynn Kundrata

The meeting was opened with prayer at 7:30 pm.

The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed. Frank made a motion to accept, Tony seconded.

The Treasurer's Report was reviewed. March was a good month with over \$2,000 in interest earned in addition to the proceeds from the Beef on Weck dinner. There appears to be a duplicate entry for Pastoral Ministry/Interim Ministry. Gary will check with Ralph Olney. Frank made a motion to accept the report, Dan seconded.

Tom provided a comparison of income of the first quarter from the last three years. Although pledges are up slightly from last year, unpledged donations are down. Overall, we have received \$3,250 less than this time last year.

The new color copier has been installed. We will be charged \$65 per month for the first 500 copies. After 500 copies, we will be charged \$.03 per black and white copy, \$.15 for color copies.

Tony contacted Joe Barone from Syracuse to look at the organ. From their conversation, he believes the problem is in the speaker tower. He will give us a quote for repairs.

Suburban Disposal will charge an extra \$4 per month to pick up the trashcans next to the church. It was agreed that was reasonable.

Lisa Rowley ordered 100 hymnals and a hymnal binder for the pianist for \$1,404. If anyone would like to make a donation "in memory of" of "in honor of" a loved one, we will be asking donations of \$15 per hymnal to help defray the cost. We are hoping to start using them Rally Sunday in September.

Sandy Strasenburgh ordered new plaques for the Memorial Board.

Some siding is missing from the back of the church. No leaks were noticed in the hallway after the last storm. The lock on the door to the nursery school needs to be adjusted.

Tom will look into purchasing a wireless microphone for use during "prayers and concerns". There are earphones available in the hutch in the narthex for anyone wishing to use them.

Rummage Sale/Non-Rummage Sale options for fundraisers were discussed.

Pastor received a request from the town to use the church parking lot on Memorial Day as a staging area for the parade. Gary agreed to open the church for anyone who needs to use the restrooms.

Dan is part of a group that donates toys to CURE. He will contact Julia Ingraham about making donations to the CURE Picnic.

It is time to renew our advertising agreement with Westside News. The cost is \$500, which includes advertising in the Hamlin Herald and the Suburban News for fundraisers.

Pastor Walter will be on vacation the week after Easter.

The meeting was closed with prayer at 8:40 pm.




