Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Psalm 51:10

#### Trustee Meeting 6-19-19

The meeting was opened with prayer at 7:00 pm.

The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed. Tony made an amendment to the minutes that we donated \$200 to VBS as requested not \$300. Tony made a motion to approve the minutes, Dan seconded.

The Treasurers Report was reviewed. \$3,000 from the checking account was deposited in the savings account. The checking account is doing well, all budget lines are on target. Due to fluctuations in the market we lost \$3,000 in interest for the month of May but still have overall gains of \$14,000 year to date. Frank made a motion to approve, Dan seconded.

New hymnals have been ordered; they will be delivered in September. Requests for donations will be made to offset the cost. We will look into the best way to retire the old hymnals.

Marilynn will be added to the bank account so she can assist with the banking in Ralph's absence.

Jason Miller and Abigail Jenks have applied for the Timmerman Scholarship. Abby has started baptism classes with Rev. Walter and will be baptized to fulfill her requirements. They will be recognized with a reception on June 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Tom purchased a new sump pump. All sump pumps have been replaced within the last two years.

A request was made for an emergency family donation. We currently do not have an emergency discretionary fund. All expenses are voted on by the congregation at the Annual Meeting. If we were to start such a fund it would have to be voted on by the congregation.

Brockport College is having a community service day on August 24<sup>th</sup> as part of their orientation. Students would be available that day to do yard work or cleaning at the church. Gary will contact them.

The Eagle Scouts are building a War Memorial Wall next to the gazebo in Kendall. Engraved bricks will be \$100 each. Frank made a motion to purchase a brick to honor Morton Baptist Church veterans, Dan seconded.

After reviewing our finances, it was agreed that total compensation for a part-time minister will be \$28,000 per year, to be disbursed as the minister deems appropriate.

It was suggested that we include more activities in our ad in the Suburban News, such as Bible Study, Youth Group, Coffee Hour.

If anyone has any ideas for community outreach, please contact the Trustees. We would like more activities that make MBC more visible in the community.

The meeting was closed with prayer at 8:25 pm.




Please keep Alice Richardson in your prayers. She was hospitalized at Strong with colitis in mid-June. She is now home and resting.


Marilynn Kundrata's mother-in-law, Joyce, has been hospitalized with bronchitis. We pray for a quick recovery!


