Then again, even when we get to Advent, our church is already moving along. The Harvest Supper, CURE Picnic and Thanksgiving have already happened, and the choir is well into practicing the Christmas cantata.

There is a lot to be said for the fall, we have warm days and cool nights, so we can turn off the air conditioner. We might need to put on a jacket or sweater, but boots and gloves are not yet necessary. Football season begins and baseball's pennant race heats up toward the World Series and the leaves turn their beautiful color. Usually somewhere someone has a fire going, and we smell the wood smoke or sit around the fire ourselves.

There is a lot to be said for fall within the church. We will see more people in the pews and enjoy the choir on Sunday morning. Old friends return, and we renew those relationships. When we're all together the Spirit works in wonderful ways. As any preacher will tell you, the more people in the pews, the more they are encouraged.

My hope is that you share my delight and excitement about the fall. Let's look forward to what God has in store for us in the months ahead.

Most line items are on budget. The expense for the color copier is up, although we are no longer purchasing preprinted bulletins, so we are saving money there. John Curtis and Dale Rowley will be taken off the banking accounts, Marilynn Kundrata will be added. Frank made a motion to approve, Tony seconded.

Mary Campbell requested that her pay for filling in as pianist for Andrew Cook be donated back to the church. The money will be donated to the Youth Group.

Dan Cater requested a new vacuum cleaner be purchased. We also need new castors for the chair rack and a submersible pump and hose to drain the baptistry. Gary will discuss these purchases with Dan.

Diane Grimm indicated that this may be her last year at Country Mouse. Ralph will contact her and discuss options of continuing a nursery school or other uses for this space.

The light overlooking the parking lot is not working, another light will be installed.

There is a green stain on the siding that needs to be cleaned.

Instructions of how to keep the front door unlocked will be posted.

The meeting was closed with prayer at 6:45 PM.

Please keep the family of Ann White's sister, Mary, in your prayers. Her stepdaughter, Aubrey, passed away.




