PUBLIC COMMENT

Truda Slocum, Lakeshore Road – asked if the water line has begun for Kendall road. Supervisor Cammarata said no, because one easement has not been signed. If the property owner will not sign, the Town can ask permission from the State to use its easement along the road. There was also the delay due to arguing with the State about trees. It is hoped that both that line and the West Kendall Road line will be installed in early 2020.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Martin made the following motion, seconded by Councilwoman Szozda:

RESOLUTION 80-0919 WD 7 BUDGET MODIFICATION

Whereas the Town of Kendall developed the budget for the Water District Seven project based on an estimate for the cost to repair and repave Norway Road following construction of the improvements, and

Whereas the actual cost for the paving work will be more than the current budgeted amount,

Be it therefore resolved, that the Town Board hereby authorizes an increase in the budget for the Direct Expenditures – Additional Materials of \$12,168.17, from \$44,459.00 to \$56,627.17, with a corresponding decrease in Contingency.

Discussion: Councilwoman Szozda asked if this increase would be passed on to the water users. Supervisor Cammarata answered no, as there was extra money in the contingency fund which were unused. Improvements were made to Norway Road. The USDA approved this transfer.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Councilwoman Flow made the following motion, seconded by Councilman Martin:

RESOLUTION 81-0919 AWARDING LANDSCAPING OF TOWN HALL PROJECT

Whereas bids were solicited for plans and cost estimates of landscaping replacement at the Kendall Town Hall, according to the Town's Purchasing and Procurement Policy and

Whereas at least two bids were submitted and reviewed by members of the Town Board, and it was determined that the bid from Preston Lawn Care & Landscaping was the most attractive and reasonable, so

Now, therefore, be it RESOLVED to award the bid to Preston Lawn Care and Landscaping, 14846 Zig-Zag Road, Albion, New York 14411, for a cost not to exceed \$ 2,526.

Discussion: Councilwoman Flow stated this is for materials only, no labor. Supervisor Cammarata said another resolution will be considered next year to pay for the labor involved as the next phase is completed.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Councilwoman Szozda made the following motion, seconded by Councilman Martin:

RESOLUTION 82-0919 MARRIAGE LICENSE FEE WAIVED FOR ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY APPLICANTS

Whereas New York State has passed legislation to waive its portion of marriage license fees (\$22.50 each) if either applicant is an active duty member of the Armed Forces, and, also allows for each local registrar district to waive its fee also, and

Whereas this Kendall Town Board does desire to waive its local marriage license fee (\$17.50 each) also, for active duty members of the Armed Forces, so

Be it Resolved, that the Town of Kendall waives such fees for marriage licenses and certificates normally collected, if either applicant is an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces at the time of application.

Clerk Richardson said this will not have a significant financial impact, as this is rare. The law itself is confusing and lacks definitions, but waiving the fee and to whom it applies has been clarified by the NYS Health Department.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.

Councilman Martin made the following motion, seconded by Councilwoman Flow:

RESOLUTION 83-0919 CANCELLING NOVEMBER WORKSESSION

Whereas the General Election is scheduled for November 5, 2019 and will be held at the Kendall Town Hall, and

Whereas that is a date on which a Kendall Town Board Work Session Meeting is scheduled, now

Therefore, be it resolved to cancel said work session.

Further, this cancellation will be noticed in the Town's official newspaper, on its website, and posted on the Town Clerk's official notice board.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, resulting in all ayes, and declared the motion carried.
