- 1) Sewers - Grant Funding to pursue the single largest project the town has ever embarked upon.
 - 2) Water District 11 - Income Survey status so we can establish a district, and obtain funding through USDA or New York State.
 - 3) Curtis Field – We are awaiting final paperwork from our attorney to finalize this transition from the Morton Fire District to the Town of Kendall. Once this is completed, Councilwoman Barbara Flow will chair an ad-hoc committee of any residents who wish to participate to recommend to the town board for possible uses of this property.
 - 4) Morton Cemetery - After waiting for several months, I contacted Senator Robb Ort's office for assistance. They informed me that the check was cut on January 2, 2024. We still are waiting. So, I may need to reconnect with Senator Ort's office for assistance again.
